

Who decides what is taught at KS4?

The Government still prescribes a National Curriculum at Key Stage 4 and this, along with performance measures, determines a significant proportion of what is taught at Key Stage 4.

The Core Curriculum

English (Language and Literature)

Mathematics

Science

Religious Education (we are a Catholic school)

Physical Education (not a qualification unless chosen as an option)

Curriculum for life (delivered during form time)





Key Stage 4 Qualifications

All qualifications are Level 1/2 which means you can achieve a Grade 9 - 1 (or equivalent) in all.

All our Key Stage 4 qualifications are worth the equivalent of one GCSE (except Science) and can lead to further study within the Sixth Form or a college.

GCSEs

All GCSEs are linear – this means that the examinations are taken at the end of the course. Grades are 9 - 1


Vocational courses

A vocational course is assessed both through work completed in class as well as some exam element at the end of the course

What is the English Baccalaureate?

The English Baccalaureate was introduced as a performance measure in the 2010 performance tables.

It is not a qualification in itself.

The measure recognises where pupils have secured a grade 5 or better across a group of academic subjects:

- English (both Language and Literature)
- Mathematics
- Two Sciences
- History or Geography
- A "Language" (we offer Spanish)



Options - all students choose 3 options

All students must choose **at least one** of...

It is recommended that many students who aspire to go to university study this...

The following combinations are not permitted:

- GCSE Computer Science and Voc. Creative iMedia
- GCSE PE and BTEC Sport
- GCSE Art and GCSE Graphics

Nationally, any student who does not achieve at least a Grade 4 in GCSE English and/or Maths must continue to study these subjects until they turn 18 or achieve a passing grade. This applies to all students, regardless of their chosen pathway.

What happens next?




Visit the subject stands in the hall and gym.
